There are thousands of health care successes every day. Countless people play vital roles in the delivery of health services in BC. Some you may meet face-to-face in your community, but many more work quietly behind the scenes.

Presented by the Health Employers Association of BC (HEABC), the *Excellence in BC Health Care Awards* celebrate the successes in our province's health care community and recognize those who are often too busy to stop and appreciate their accomplishments.

Some awards are for projects that are improving health care delivery in BC and some are for individual health employees who are shining stars and inspirations to those around them.

Eligibility

Health care involves many different types of skilled professionals – nurses, care aides, physicians, administrators, human resources professionals, support staff, maintenance workers and many others. All are eligible for an *Excellence in BC Health Care Award*.

While nominees must be employees of HEABC members, nominations can be submitted by anyone such as patients, colleagues or other members of the public. Project-based awards must have taken place during the last two calendar years (2010-2011). Health Care Hero nominations can be for a lifetime of achievement or for more recent successes.

The selection process

The awards are judged by a committee of volunteers which includes community leaders in business, science, technology, health and academia.

Winners will be notified in late April 2012.

Awards categories

TOP INNOVATION - AFFILIATE

This award is for a project or best practice by one of HEABC's affiliate members that has brought fresh ideas or superior problem-solving skills to the health field. Affiliate members deliver a wide array of publicly funded, community-based health services, including long-term care, drug and alcohol treatment, and mental health services.

TOP INNOVATION - HEALTH ALITHORITY

This award is for a project or best practice by one of BC's six health authorities that has brought fresh ideas or superior problem-solving skills to the health field. Health authorities are responsible for acute, long-term care, public health and complex/long-term care.

WORKPLACE HEALTH INNOVATION

This award is for a project or best practice that makes use of leading practices to improve workplace and worker health and safety. Winning projects demonstrate leadership, vision and measurable results in improving the health and safety of health care employees, e.g. reducing sick time or workplace injuries.

COLLABORATIVE SOLUTIONS

This award recognizes a project or best practice that harnesses the collective efforts of any joint project within the health system that has yielded positive outcomes. This collaboration could be within one site or through multiple sites and with non-health partners, interregional projects or teams. The project should demonstrate how an integrated approach yielded better outcomes.
